

Performance styles

<p>Realism</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Actors present characters in a 'lifelike' way • They think about character motivation and naturalistic actions and reactions • Linear plot • Realistic set and costume • Research the practitioner <i>Stanislavski</i> 	<p>Musical theatre</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Action appears realistic but is usually stylised or exaggerated • Can be complete fantasy • Musical numbers / songs tend to highlight key moments in the plot • Usually has a linear plot • Set and costume may be symbolic or stylised • Research the productions <i>Chicago</i> and <i>Cabaret</i> 	<p>Non-naturalism</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Performance symbolises emotions / thoughts / abstract ideas • Characters may not be real people • Set / costume / lighting is always symbolic • Performances are usually non linear • Research the practitioner <i>Artaud</i>
<p>Episodic / political</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Performance does not tell just one story- it will focus on a series of episodes that may not be connected but linked by a <i>theme</i> • Performance is designed to make the audience <i>think</i> about an issue • Uses direct audience address • May use comedy but again, in a way that makes the audience <i>think</i> rather than just be entertained • Research the practitioner <i>Brecht</i> 	<p>Surreal</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • May appear naturalistic at first but language does not always make sense- it is symbolic and 'dreamlike' • The meaning is not always clear- open to interpretation • Set / costume / lighting is usually symbolic • Research the writers <i>Harold Pinter</i> / <i>Eugene Ionesco</i> 	<p>Storytelling theatre</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A production style that usually reinterprets traditional stories • A range of techniques are adopted- music, narration, puppetry etc... • Usually non naturalistic • Always looking for unique and imaginative ways to communicate ideas. • Research the theatre company <i>Kneehigh</i>
